Sara Gleicher, Kathy Kalil, Danene Charles, Bob Gleichauf, President Glenn, Rick Goward and Jim Thorpe all had "Happy Buck" announcements. Going to Milwaukee to see children and grandchildren. Five or six Dearborn schools are receiving playground equipment for disabled children through Dearborn Rotary Foundation and Healthy Dearborn – a particular third grader at Salina plus five or six principals are all smiles because of this. Grateful for Rotarian support for recent Career Days at Dearborn High and Fordson – have one more opportunity at Edsel Ford on April 30, 2019. Happy for local volunteer support for March Reading Month – Gov. Whitmer is reading today at River Oaks. Musicians attract all ages of women and some are good tipplers, too, which increases Happy Buck donations. Student responses regarding recent Youth Month were: amazing opportunity, gained wisdom, amusing and interacting with different generations, gained tips about adult life, and thanks for the support. Attended high school orientation with my daughter and she is already becoming involved with Interact plus bowling. Janice Gilliland worked "Happy Buck" microphone, donations of \$5 and even \$20 (groupie money) were made, \$33 was raised in total.

Today's program was a video interview of former Dearborn Rotarian, Hugh Archer (now deceased). Roles he served in Rotary included: President of Rotary International in 1989-1990 and also served as its General Secretary, Rotary International Director, District Governor, and Dearborn Rotary President. Hugh was a Dearborn Rotarian from 1951 till his death in 2005. Video was from former "Good Company" local cable TV show produced by Dearborn Rotary and hosted by Dearborn Rotarian Bates Feuell (now deceased). Rotarians, such as Neil Allen and Roger Miller, were part of production crew for TV show (Roger edited this video).

Hugh was an engineer and worked for Detroit Edison before World War II. He served as science officer in the Navy and was involved with Manhattan Project, due to his background in radiation studies. Hugh viewed atomic bomb as a weapon of peace, it ended war with Japan and has not been used in war since, due to its' potential devastation. He became involved in plastics business after WWII. A client came to him to solve a plastic production problem and Hugh invented a machine to solve the problem. He was a manufacturer in the hula hoop craze, which faded after 90 days – it took three years to get rid of his last 30 minutes of hula hoop production.

Through Rotary, Hugh Archer met with Indira Ghandi of India for 30 minutes. He also met with leaders of Argentina and Tanzania plus other world leaders. Hugh went around world 4.5 times through Rotary. He was at a Rotary meeting in Berlin, when the wall came down. Hugh visited Moscow to bring Rotary to former Soviet Union, which was political challenge. Feels Rotary helped bring down Iron Curtain and came to believe peace is possible.

After the video, Rotarians that knew Hugh shared memories. Roger Miller said Hugh invented and patented process to manufacture curly phone cord covers. Hugh also served as General Secretary of Rotary International when he was President.

Bob Gleichauf said Hugh Archer was delight to be around at meetings and he was on the vocal side. Hugh with Joe Hallissey, John Fish and others were the founders of the Dearborn Rotary Foundation.

Merritt Robertson described Hugh Archer as a humble man who treated everyone the same. He remembers Hugh waving his napkin around at meetings and saying "point of order".

Lee Hollmann also described Hugh as a humble guy, despite his accomplishments and wealth. Hugh would talk to anyone. Hugh Archer Scholarship was created to honor Hugh after his death. Roger Miller created golf outing to support scholarship. Hugh's company, Spiratex Corporation, and his family also support scholarship. It started with one \$1,500 scholarship and has evolved to two \$4,000 scholarships and two \$1,500 Veterans' scholarships. All are funded via 5% of the endowment. Visit Dearborn Rotary website and read about Hugh's accomplishments under Archer Scholarship. Hugh's daughter Lucy will be at Scholarships Celebration and she regularly attends golf outing. His other two daughters live on opposite coasts and are here less often. Hugh Archer also has honors at UM-D Environmental Center plus a brass plaque next to ticket window at Performing Arts Center.

Rick Goward said he enjoys hearing about past Club history. Shannon Peterson said she enjoyed listening to Bob Gleichauf present about Dearborn Rotary at our booth at recent Chamber event. President Glenn said Club is trying to increase our membership. He said PE Eric Rader reported back from PETS Training all Rotary Clubs are having membership problems and are looking for ways to increase membership.

Dearborn Rotary Club meeting closed with us reciting the Four-Way Test in unison.

## Edsel Ford Mock Interviews May 13 & 14

Hello Past and Potential Mock Interviewers:

For the past three years our future graduates have ended their final semester with a Mock Interview. When we first did this it was an experiment to see how seriously our seniors would embrace the Mock Interview process. It was also our attempt to infuse more informational reading and writing into our pacing guide. Over these last two years we have heard, coming out of Lansing, that students should be exposed to more informational reading and writing opportunities. So once again the Dearborn School District is ahead of the curve. These past three years have seen nearly 100% participation on the part of our seniors. In past years we have reached out to members of our school district's Central Administration and local businesses to take part in this Mock Interview process. We would like to solicit any help that leaders and members of the local community can provide in this activity. Edsel Ford's Mock Interviews will be held on May 13 and 14 during the school day.

What we have tried to do is provide our students with an opportunity to experience the interview process and the things they will be required to do to prepare for their interviews. Most of our students have never held a job, let alone written cover letters, résumés or requested letters of recommendation in a formal manner. Most have never contemplated a career that they might be interested in pursuing. This has been an eye opening experience for the seniors.

Gretchen Bajorek has been kind enough to create a Goggle Sign Up Sheet that I can send to anyone interested in participating. We have it set up for one hour segments with interviews lasting between 3 to 4 minutes. If you send me an email expressing interest or know someone or an organization that is willing to volunteer, I will send the Google Sheet for you or them to sign up for a specific time. ### **This is what they will bring to the interview:**

A manila folder containing:

- Mock Interview Checklist (for your use with each student)

  - Only use "Comment" section if you feel it necessary

  - Students have been instructed to not ask "How did I do?"

- Cover Letter

- Résumé

  - At the top you will find an "Objective" heading

  - Next to it they indicate the type of job they are interested in seeking

  - They are expecting generic questions from you, so you do not need to role play being an employer in their specific field.

- Three letters of recommendation from real people

We will have addressed appropriate personal grooming, attire and behaviors expected at interviews.

Many have identified a career they would like to pursue, and looked for potential employers to put on their résumés. Our focus has been on the students finding and using standard acceptable business formats for their material and getting them to be concerned with producing perfect cover letters and résumés.

Thanks you all so very much. We are certain that we are providing informational reading and writing skills that are practical and useful in their lives.

The Dearborn Rotary Foundation is the philanthropic entity of the Dearborn Rotary Club. We are a 501C3 Tax entity. Our purpose is to house, invest, and distribute the funds raised by the Dearborn Rotary Club. The funds represented in the Foundation come from a variety of sources. Some are bequeathed, some are cash contributions, and others are what we term restricted funds based on the restrictions requested by the donor. We currently have 4 restricted funds (the Archer, The Sisson, Past Presidents, and the Otto Rowen) , one endowment fund, and our General Fund. All told, the value is over \$1 Million.

We have many requests that come to the Dearborn Rotary Foundation. Some come from the Club Board of Directors, some come from individual members of the club, and others come from those outside the club. The Board of Trustees meets once per month to consider all requests it receives. This year, we have been busy in our giving. Grants approved so far this year have been:
