Mary Jo Durivage, from League of Women Voters District serving Dearborn, Dearborn Heights and Inkster, thanked Dearborn Rotary for our support of printing costs for their "2019 Who's Who of Your Elected Officials". Copies of pamphlet were distributed to all tables. She also promoted "What Should Michigan's Transportation Network Look Like in 2045" conversation this Saturday at John D. Dingell Transit Center. Eric Rader, Ray Trudeau, and Margaret Blohm all had "Happy Buck" announcements. Eric had a great weekend at PETS training in Kalamazoo. He has attended two Dearborn Rotary Board meetings, 2018-2019 and 2019-2020, over past two weeks. Spring is here, even though fall like, presently. Ray just got back from Nicaragua and political situation has improved. Medical team is visiting Children of Dump project in November or December 2019. Weather was 100° during recent four day visit. Margaret's recent week-long vacation in Arizona was a great time.

Michael Scott Bellenir from Michael Scott Consulting was today's speaker. He is a certified life and success coach. Michael was also a lay leader in young adult ministry. His interest in getting generations to work together led to his study of Millennials, those born roughly between 1980 and 2000. Communication is biggest gap. We heard characteristics of Baby Boom, Generation X and Millennial generations. Each generation formed opinions from their experiences. Millennials like doing things and are socially conscious. They will give up a six-figure job to do something they care about. You need to adapt leadership principles to work with each generation. Baby Boomers and Generation X need to mentor Millennials, because older generations have more experiences. Millennials can also mentor older generations regarding social media, due to their greater experiences with it.

Mentorship and learning via failure also teaches leadership. Michael shared his experiences with Presbyterian Youth Mentorship Camp starting in junior high school and leadership skills it taught him. He was involved with program for 20 years. Program lets students fail and let them learn. Program is totally youth lead and helped Michael become an entrepreneur.

Rotary has to show value in organization to attract Millennials and provide socially conscious service opportunities. You need to find out what Millennials want and sell them on value. What are they really passionate about and how to be involved. Older generation has to mentor Millennials and also let them fail, so they can learn.

Lee Hollmann and Rick Goward both had questions and comments. As Millennials age, they develop planning skills. Presbyterian Youth Mentorship Camp helped Michael develop planning skills. Millennials generally do not like corporate America business structure. Trust is an important experience for Millennials. They are involved in knowledge economy.

President Nominee Colleen thanked Michael Scott Bellenir for his presentation and invited him to sign a children's book to be donated to Dearborn Public Library. Dearborn Rotary Club meeting closed with us reciting the Four-Way Test in unison.

The Dearborn Rotary Foundation is the philanthropic entity of the Dearborn Rotary Club. We are a 501C3 Tax entity. Our purpose is to house, invest, and distribute the funds raised by the Dearborn Rotary Club. The funds represented in the Foundation come from a variety of sources. Some are bequeathed, some are cash contributions, and others are what we term restricted funds based on the restrictions requested by the donor. We currently have 4 restricted funds (the Archer, The Sisson, Past Presidents, and the Otto Rowen) , one endowment fund, and our General Fund. All told, the value is over \$1 Million.

We have many requests that come to the Dearborn Rotary Foundation. Some come from the Club Board of Directors, some come from individual members of the club, and others come from those outside the club. The Board of Trustees meets once per month to consider all requests it receives. This year, we have been busy in our giving. Grants approved so far this year have been:
