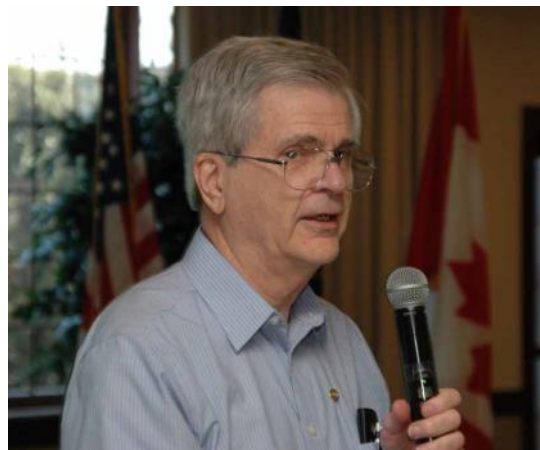

DACdb or "District and Club database" serves all 50 Rotary clubs in District 6400. Today's speaker, PDG Jim Karolyi, chairs DACdb for District 6400, plus chairs RYLA. Software is used by Rotary Districts and Clubs across North America. A person in Denver maintains software. Jim provided Club members with handouts about DACdb plus had a PowerPoint presentation. A screensaver photograph, taken by Jim of past summer's solar eclipse with corona, started presentation. Jim complimented Dearborn Rotary and Webmaster Jim Ives regarding our website – thinks it is best in District. Our website is a good introduction to Rotary. Our individual member contact information plus Club information are included in DACdb. You can contact PDG Jim Karolyi during daytime, if you have questions about using or accessing DACdb.

You can use contact information in DACdb to connect with other Dearborn Rotarians plus other District 6400 Rotarians – it is a membership directory. Our Club committee structure (64 committees – most in District) plus Rotary District 6400 committees are all listed in DACdb. PDG Jim Karolyi explained to us how to access DACdb.

Kathy Gapa, Art Hamparian, **Susan Dabaja**, Jim Ives, **Diane Ives**, Glenn Maleyko, and Rick Goward all had questions or comments. Use your e-mail address and membership number to access DACdb. Membership number (leave off zero at beginning) is found on address label of your Rotarian magazine. They try to protect DACdb info. from computer hackers; so far info. has not been compromised. Our membership photograph is included in DACdb and you can update photograph or your contact information at any time. Typically only Club President, Secretary, or other approved leadership should do mass connections with other Rotary clubs. It is a powerful tool, but needs to be respected. Rotary refrains from overloading your e-mail box with mass mailings. Contact information on DACdb allows for e-mails and text messages, based on information provided. Rick Goward was contacted during meeting by Jim Karolyi via text message via info. from DACdb. Our weekly X-Ray is sent to all members via DACdb. There is a way to include a signature in DACdb communications. Club Directors can utilize DACdb to study membership to populate committees. Member biographical information on DACdb might help you with choosing a vocational speaker.

President Bob thanked PDG Jim Karolyi for his presentation. Formal Dearborn Rotary Club meeting ended with us reciting the Four-Way Test in unison. Jim Karolyi and Diane Ives then led hands-on work with individual members on how to access DACdb via laptop or tablet. Scholarship Celebration Committee met after formal meeting.

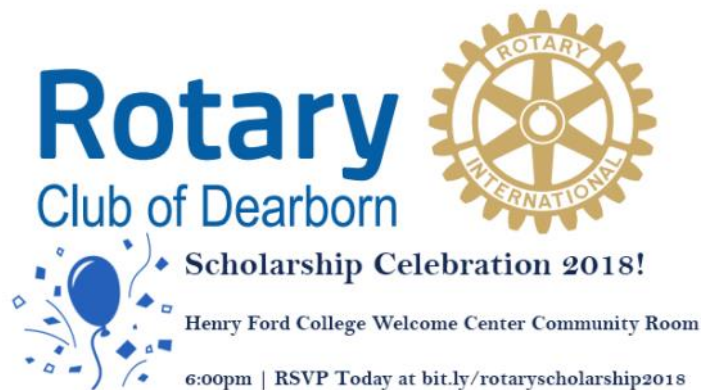

Opportunities for Fellowship

Most Rotarians are successful professional and business executives because they hear opportunities knock and take advantage of them. Once a week the opportunity for Rotary fellowship occurs at each club meeting, but not all members hear it knocking. The weekly club meeting is a special privilege of Rotary membership. It provides the occasion to visit with fellow members, to meet visitors you have not known before, and to share your personal friendship with other members. Rotary clubs that have a reputation for being "friendly clubs" usually follow a few simple steps:

- First, members are encouraged to sit in a different seat or at a different table each week.
- Second, Rotarians are urged to sit with a member they may not know as well as their long-time personal friends.
- Third, members invite new members or visitors to join their table just by saying: "Come join us, we have an empty chair at this table."
- Fourth, members share the conversation around the table rather than merely eating in silence or talking privately to the person next to them.
- Fifth, Rotarians make a special point of trying to get acquainted with all members of the club by seeking out those they may not know.

When Rotarians follow these five easy steps, an entirely new opportunity for fellowship knocks each week. Soon Rotarians realize that warm and personal friendship is the cornerstone of every great Rotary club.
