Meeting Notes

Tonight's meeting was the fourth annual Rotary Club of Dearborn Scholarships Celebration and it took place at the Henry Ford College Welcome Center Community Room. The room was full for dinner event and included 27 honored scholarship students, their parents and teachers, plus Rotarians. Total scholarship money awarded was \$65,100.

Dearborn Rotary President Glenn Maleyko opened the celebration greeting our honorees and their families plus all in attendance. Glenn spoke about why he belongs to Rotary and some of the activities of Dearborn Rotary. He said Dearborn Public Schools ranks in top ten school districts in State for students pursuing higher education.

Bob Gleichauf, Dearborn Rotary Past President did the invocation and said students we are honoring tonight do the community proud. He thanked Dearborn and Fordson High School Interact Clubs for their assistance at last Saturday's Adopt-A-Highway Telegraph Clean-Up and included our Sisson Scholarship honoree. Bob closed with a prayer.

We enjoyed a good dinner and fellowship. An evening program booklet was at each place setting listing the scholarships, history of the scholarships, honorees and their accomplishments, sponsors, and information about Rotary.

President Glenn recorded Scholarship Gala with a selfie and thanked all the volunteers who organized this event. Glenn congratulated Dearborn Rotarian Adel Mozip on his recent appointment to Dearborn Public Schools Board of Education.

Past President Merritt Robertson spoke about Rotary International Foundation and its mission plus Paul Harris, founder of Rotary. We heard about near eradication of polio, clean water initiatives, peace scholars, and recent Fordson High School Interact Club service project in the Dominican Republic. Dearborn Rotary Past President John McDonald was recognized as a Multiple Paul Harris Fellow. John's career was in English Department at Henry Ford College and he said Rotary was very rewarding for him.

Dearborn Rotary Past President Bob Ziolkowski introduced the presentation of the scholarships. Presentation divided students into two groups. First group of students were Sisson, Archer, Past Presidents, and Henry Ford College honorees. Second group was the Otto Rowen honorees. Each student was photographed by David Mustonen as they received their scholarship. Photographs of scholarship honorees will be posted on both Dearborn Rotary and Dearborn Public Schools web pages.

Nicholas Tafelski from Dearborn High School was recipient of Harry Sisson Scholarship and was presented by Dearborn Rotary Past President Regan Ford. Harry Sisson was a successful local builder and Rotarian, who lived by Rotary motto "Service Above Self". The scholarship is awarded to an outstanding Dearborn public or private high school graduating senior. The \$8,500 scholarship will be used at University of Michigan where Nicholas will be studying engineering. Nick was involved with Dearborn Rotary's My Potential Mentoring Program, Meals on Wheels, Dearborn Goodfellows, St. Alphonsus Food Basket Drive, etc. He excelled in classroom and on athletic field.

Hugh Archer Scholarship was presented by Dearborn Rotarian Martha Hnatiuk. Martha described Hugh Archer as a humanitarian and inspirational leader. His three daughters help support this scholarship. Tanya Hammoud from Dearborn High School and Yasmine Slimani from Fordson High School were each awarded a \$4,000 scholarship. Both students have high academic achievements and both were involved in many student organizations. Tanya was described as "the consummate servant leader" plus as "dedicated and fearless and one of the best leaders I have seen". She was involved with My Potential Mentoring Program and plans to study microbiology. Yasmine was described as demonstrating "unmatched compassion, responsibility and leadership". She is pursuing a medical career at University of Michigan.

Past President's Leadership Scholarship was presented by Dearborn Rotary Past President Margaret Blohm. Chairperson of this scholarship committee, Past President Hassen Hammoud (our "spreadsheet President"), was not able to attend due to a health issue. Margaret invited all in attendance to sign a card for Hassen. Past President and retired Dearborn educator Dr. Robert Young was also recognized by Margaret. Bob started Past Presidents scholarship and was not able to attend tonight. Iman Alshawk and Mariam Markabani from Fordson High School and David C. Boettger and Alexander Restum from Dearborn High Schools were each awarded a \$3,000. Past Presidents scholarship. We heard about arriving in U.S four years ago and learning English on You-Tube and then scoring 1400 on S.A.T., shaving head for a leukemia run, being an "ambassador of goodwill", and earning an Eagle Scout badge and applying the Four-Way Test.

Fadia Shahrour and Chase Uren were each recipients of \$550. Rotary HFC Nursing Scholarship, which was presented by PP Lee Hollmann. Both students are graduating from Henry Ford College nursing program this year and both are involved in volunteer organizations. Susan Skunkwiler, Dean of the HFC School of Health and Human Services, was recognized for her assistance in choosing the two honorees. HFC President Russell A. Kavalhuna (and Dearborn Rotarian) was thanked for his support of Scholarship Gala.

Alexandria Chambers from the University of Michigan – Dearborn was the recipient of the \$1,500. Hugh Archer Veterans Scholarship. PP Lee Hollmann said Alex has a child, works almost full-time, volunteers, and is studying for a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering. Tom Pitock from UM-D Veteran's Office was thanked for his assistance in choosing Alex. A second veteran's scholarship is planned through Judge Gene Hunt and the Dearborn District Court.

Otto Rowen Scholarship was presented by Dearborn Rotarian Sue Surducan. There were 42 applicants for the scholarship and seventeen were chosen. John Bayerl, from Dearborn Public Schools was thanked for his big assist in organizing awarding of this scholarship. The \$2,000. scholarship may be used for tuition, books, and school fees for students attending college or advanced training. Sarah Ali, Emma Best, Mariam Dabaja, Yasmeen Elgahmi, Amani Elhaj, Batoul Hammoud, Miryim Hanek, Samah Hassan, Lauren Hopping, Maya Kadouh, Riley Ketvirtis, Lilian Marsh, Holly Pizzini, Kara Pumer, Ibrahim Saleh, Joe Shaffer, and Manar Wady were the honorees. Students were from Fordson, Edsel Ford and Dearborn High Schools, Michael Berry Career Center, Henry Ford Early College, and Dearborn Center for Math Science & Technology (DCMST). Career plans for Otto Rowen honorees include: nurse, physical therapist, Disney marketing team, nurse practitioner, dental hygienist, a dentist using a cad/cam system, CPA and then CFO, pediatrician, corporate executive through U of M Ross School of Business, business entrepreneur, environmental engineer or design architect, animation and game design, and current pharmacy technician studies then EMT then surgeon.

President Glenn Maleyko thanked everyone for attending and said Rotary has given a great deal to him. He had Rotarians in attendance recite the Four-Way Test. Glenn said Four-Way Test in non-partisan and non-secular and has been translated into more than 100 languages. It is part of who we are as Rotarians and President Glenn offered Four-Way Test to our student scholarship honorees. President Glenn closed with congratulations and offers you best for your future life.
