In prayer, Bob said think of those lost and thanks for our country. Today's greeter was Shannon Peterson, but there were no guests to introduce.

Regan Ford said his final Board meeting as club president, is Tuesday, June 13, 2017, at 5:30 PM at school administration building.

Kathy Gapa led 50/50 drawing this week and drew winning ticket.

Shannon Peterson was winner of \$12. She promptly donated winnings to Dearborn Rotary Foundation.

Jim Ives led the induction of new Dearborn Rotarian, **Travis Furlow**, who is sponsored by **Jim Thorpe**. Travis is a business consultant, is married to Dina and father of three children. Travis was encouraged to wear his Rotary pin daily. He has already volunteered to be a mentor with Launch Detroit plus is chairing Dearborn Rotary Fishing Derby at Homecoming.

Today's program was President Regan Ford's experiences at recent Rotary district conference. We heard we are in Rotary District 6400 and there are 529 Rotary Districts worldwide. Districts are divided in 34 Zones and we are soon to be in Rotary Zone 26. District 6400 includes part of Southeast Michigan and Southwest Ontario. Sue Gold-

sen is current District Governor and Rick Caron from Windsor 1918 is District Governor Elect.

District Conference is an annual event that takes place each year in a different city outside of District 6400. This year event was at Renaissance Hotel on Lake Erie in downtown Cleveland. It was near Rock N Roll Hall of Fame, Cavaliers Basketball Arena, near Christmas Story House, a casino and a shopping center was attached to hotel. Next year's District Conference is on Mackinaw Island at Grand Hotel. Regan heard about how service clubs are struggling for members, 6% of Rotarians are under 40 years old, 33% are women, 55 new members were inducted into Rotary District 6400 clubs last year, and Hines Park PM Club is newest club in District.

PE Bob Gleichauf told about catered Rotary District dinner with live music at Rock N Roll Hall of Fame. They had run of entire museum and exhibits were interesting. It was a fun and casual evening. Bob said Downtown Cleveland was beautiful. Cleveland was chosen for District Conference because Arch Klumph (1869-1951), sixth president of Rotary International and founder of Rotary International Foundation, was from Cleveland. This is the 100th anniversary of the Foundation and they visited the Arch Klumph Memorial right outside Rock N Roll Hall of Fame.

President Regan said Rotary International Past President Rick King was a featured conference speaker and told great stories. You learned about service projects at District Conference other Rotary clubs were doing locally and worldwide. They heard about how one Rotary club is taking on human trafficking by handing out care packages to the abused. Dress for Success and video "Threads" on U-Tube were presented at District Conference and told how they help women who are in desperate situations. There was a clothing drive for Dress for Success at District Conference. Service projects Launch Detroit and Kids Against Hunger were also

highlighted at District Conference. Levi Johnson, a Launch Detroit alumni, and his "Mighty Fine Soul Sauce" were at District Conference. Many Club awards are presented at District Conference and include Hedke, Devlin, Archer, etc. plus individual awards.

Dearborn Rotarian and PDG Jim Ives was honored with H. William Ives Lifetime Achievement Award at District Conference. Jim said his father was a Detroit Rotarian who served in almost every capacity in Rotary, except International President. His dad was a master public speaker and liked singing and music. Jim said his dad passed away this past December and receiving award was particularly meaningful. Jim described District Conferences as great weekends with professionally produced programs. It typically runs from Thursday evening through Sunday morning. It is total Rotary immersion. Hugh Archer started tradition of leaving District as a destination Conference because he wanted Rotarians involved with Conference and not home or business.

Ray Trudeau was recognized at District Conference for his work with Children of the Dump. ADG Noel Jackson from Trenton Club called Ray a hero.

Jim Thorpe said a Conference participant shared an elevator at Renaissance Hotel with the Red Hot Chili Peppers, who were in town for an honor at Rock N Roll Hall of Fame. Jack Mueller announced Bob Young's birthday is this week.

Adel Mozip asked Club members to think about and keep Yemen in their prayers. There is a civil war going on there and an outbreak of Cholera. Doctors' Without Borders is working there.

Dearborn Rotary Club meeting ended with Jim Ives leading us in reciting the Four-Way Test in unison.

Adopt A Highway



Adopt-A-Highway is a state program that has been in existence since 1985 when a Tyler Texas Civitan Club adopted a section of Hwy. 69. Since then, there are 49 states that have adopted the program. The program is intended to encourage volunteers to keep a section of a highway free from litter. In exchange for regular litter removal, an organization is allowed to have its name posted on a sign in the section of the highways they maintain.

Dearborn Rotary has been doing this project over 20 years, and we still maintain the section of Telegraph between Ford Road and Michigan Ave. Our collection of trash happens 3 times per year. Once in April, once in July, and finally in September. The dates for pick up are determined by the State of Michigan.
