## Thursday's Meeting Summary

President Regan Ford led today's meeting, which opened with the singing of the National Anthem. PE Bob Gleichauf did the Invocation, which mentioned VJ Day and a prayer giving thanks for country and freedom plus giving us strength for service.

President Regan announced the Literacy Breakfast is September 23, 2016, Friday, 7:30 till 9:00 AM at Henry Ford Village. Diane Ives is looking for committee members to help with the event, table sponsors, and attendees.

Our September 15, 2016, Thursday meeting will be a picnic at 5:30 PM at Midway Golf & Entertainment Center on Van Born Road in Dearborn Heights. We are encouraged to bring our families to enjoy the go-carts, put-put golf, driving range, climbing wall, bumper cars, batting cages, etc.

Covenant House, which helps the homeless, plus PM Club community programs, will be benefactors of this fundraiser. Participants are encouraged to dress in 1980s style. Kids Against Hunger packaging event is Saturday, October 15, 2016, at 9:00 AM at Henry Ford College cafeteria. Rotarians, Rotaract, Interact and family members

from fourteen clubs in District 6400 will package 100,000 meals via assembly line. Last year 400 volunteers including about 100 Allen Park Interact students did the packaging. Dearborn Rotary Foundation has donated \$2,000. to this program. Packaging takes about two hours. See Sue Surducan for more details and to volunteer.

Jim Mackey led the 50/50 raffle today. President Regan drew the winning ticket. Scott Starks was the winner of \$11.

Today's program was a Club Assembly led by Treasurer Roger Miller and PE Bob Gleichauf. Handouts at all the tables included: Rotary Club of Dearborn Comparative Statement of Income & Expenses July 2015 – June 2016, Year End Financial Report Summary, 2016-2017 Committee Sign-up, and Dearborn Rotary Committees.

Roger said increase in dues helped with Club expenses, but we still had a small loss. Park Place requires us to purchase a minimum of 35 meals per week. We are averaging 30 to 32 paid meals per week by our members. Cost of the meals also includes cost of using the facility. If you choose not to purchase a meal, you are still welcome to the refreshments.

It was a good year for fundraising. Our total net proceeds was \$47,677. after expenses. Majority of proceeds goes to Dearborn Rotary Foundation. Part of net proceeds from Santa Snaps fundraiser went to Wayne County Parks and Fairlane Sunrise Rotary Club for their support of the fundraiser.

Rotary Club of Dearborn By-Laws has eight standing committees. They include: Club Service, Vocational Service, Community Service, International Service, Youth Service, Mem-

bership, Communications, and Fundraising. Each of our Club Directors is in charge of a committee. There are sub-committees for specific events and programs below the standing committees. Roger and Bob went through the list of committees with the Club.

Adopt A Highway is under Community Service. Sue Surducan has led the highway clean-up project for nine years. Besides plying Club members with great homemade bake goods for volunteering, Roger suggested Sue has "salted" clean-up area with real cash for clean-up volunteers to find. Roger presented Sue with a \$100. "motion picture only" bill he found at last clean-up in honor of her work.

We heard about Inter-Service Club, International Project, RYLA (a superior youth leadership program), Scholarship Awards Celebration, X-Ray, Social Media, Operations Manual, FUNd Night, Rotarian of the Year, etc. committees. We will have monthly or bi-monthly Club Assemblies to hold committee meetings. All Rotarians are expected to be on two or three committees plus volunteer for fundraisers.

We were encouraged to fill out and turn in the 2016-2017 Committee Sign-up sheets that were distributed. Committee structure was created when Dearborn Rotary had 140 members. We now have 65 members and need volunteers.

President Regan thanked Roger and Bob for their presentation and encouraged us to volunteer to serve on committees. Rotary meeting ended with singing of God Bless America.


