Today's meeting was a classification talk with two long-time members. PE Bob introduced our two speakers. PP Dan Hogan (1990-91) spoke first. Dan thanked Mr. 1/2 President for the introduction and said no way Trudeau would have won the 50/50 drawing today if he was operating it. Dan has been a member of Dearborn Rotary for 33 years, same length of time he has been married to Beth.

His first Rotary meeting was as a guest of the President and Chief Loan Officer of local NBD Bank branch in Dearborn. Dan did not know anything about Rotary, but his NBD colleague said Dearborn Rotary had a good group of people and Dan would enjoy them.

We heard about Dan's early duties in Rotary included taking attendance and being the assistant secretary at Rotary Board meetings. Both activities forced Dan to learn the names of the members and what Rotary does. Dan eventually became a club board member, secretary, treasurer, president, and then district treasurer (1991-92) under PDG Jack Mueller. He was flattered Hugh Archer, PP of Rotary International and PDG wanted him to be club president. Dan spoke of the Otto Rowen Estate and the

good it has done through the Dearborn Rotary Foundation. CPAs Mike Jones and Dale Bender have provided good stewardship to the Dearborn Rotary Foundation.

Dan is from Syracuse, New York and a graduate of Syracuse University. A finance job at Ford brought him to Dearborn. He then went to National Bank of Detroit to work in the Trust Department. Dan also worked at Chrysler in finance for one year, but returned to NBD. His family includes Beth, two successful adult sons, plus three grandchildren. Dan and Beth have a winter home in Sebring, Florida and he also belongs to the Highland County Rotary Club. Dan reminisced about how Don Karcher and he prepared, mimeographed, and mailed the X-Ray on Saturday mornings when the Club lost its Secretary.

Mike Maldegen, the youngest Dearborn Rotary President (1982-83), at age 34 years, was the second speaker. Mike's career counseling took place at Red Run Golf Club, where he was a caddy. Club pro wanted Mike to become the assistant pro, but when Mike considered the long-term weekend duties, he decided there must be a better way to remain on the golf course. Club members were generally doctors, lawyers, salesmen and heirs. Mike decided he was best suited for business after eliminating medical and law schools and his father declining him being an heir.

Mike graduated from Central Michigan University on June 7, 1969 and then proceeded to fulfill his service to the US Army. In college, Mike worked in advertising and continued this work after graduating and the Army. His Uncle Bob (PP Bob Maldegen) invited Mike to join his local Dearborn insurance agency.


