District Governor Paul Sincok was introduced by ADG Val Murphy-Goodrich. Paul joined Plymouth Rotary in 1981 and is a second generation member. He was 2001-2002 Plymouth Rotary President and a multiple Paul Harris Fellow. Paul and his wife, Traci, have hosted multiple exchange students and encouraged more Rotary Clubs to become involved with exchange student program. He is Plymouth City Manager and Paul and Traci have an affinity for all things Disney.

Neil Allen was awarded a second jewel Paul Harris Fellow pin by DG Paul for Neil's support of Rotary International Foundation. DG Paul described how RI Foundation has spent over \$1 billion on world-wide polio eradication plus additional money on other projects. Neil was thanked for his contribution.

Danene Charles was formally inducted into Dearborn Rotary by DG Paul and Glenn Maleyko was her sponsor. Glenn said Danene has been helping with Rotary projects for a couple years. DG Paul said Danene was invited to become a Rotarian because she exhibits qualities that make you a leader. As a Rotarian, she has an obligation to attend meetings, volunteer for projects, and to support the District. DG Paul welcomed Danene to Rotary and its 1.3 million members. President Glenn presented Danene with a membership pin.

DG Paul said he grew-up in Plymouth and was inspired by great dreams. He admired President Kennedy, when he announced in 1962, the US is planning on sending men to the moon. Dream was achieved in July 1969. DG Paul also admired animator Walt Disney, from the Midwest, who had big dreams and always wanted to be growing his company. Walt Disney inspired and motivated his team. Polio being eradicated in Philippines in 1972 also inspired DG Paul. By doing one thing today, you can change the future. Think about how our exchange student going to Germany will change the future.

Dearborn Rotary has a 95 year legacy DG Paul said. Your Club is involved with Adopt-A-Highway, Santa Snaps, scholarship awards, and Archer Golf Outing. Start thinking about your Club's legacy and projects for 100-year mark.

DG Paul says RI President Barry Rassin says we have to waken power of Rotary. We have to change. Rotary is not sustainable by doing same thing. This is not my father's Rotary. RI President Rassin wants to support and strengthen Clubs plus improve public image.

Ten District 6400 2018-2019 goals include highlighting World Polio Day on October 24, 2018. Encouraging "Every Rotarian Every Year". Focusing on youth through Interact, Rotaract, and Youth Exchange. Rotarians visiting other Rotary Clubs and participating in their activities. Reconnect with past Rotary alumni and scholarship honorees and find out how Rotary changed their lives. Have them speak at a meeting. Participate in District Governor Golf Outing on September 16, 2018. Participate in District 6400 Conference "Pursue the Dream" on May 10-12, 2019 at Caesars Windsor. We have great keynote speakers and this is first District Conference in district in 40 years. Flyers for Golf Outing and District Conference were on our tables. Every Club do a Club Visioning project. Participate in foundation grants, both local and global. Tell Rotary story in your local community and promote youth exchange. Make Rotary relevant by trying new ways. RI President encourages us to dream big dreams and start legacy projects. Insure Rotary is here in the future.

President Glenn thanked DG Paul Sincok for his presentation and describes him as a "great Rotary voice". He invited DG Paul to sign a book plate for a children's book to be donated to Dearborn Public library. DG Paul was given Dearborn Rotary signing pen.

Rotary Friendship Exchange

The Rotary Friendship Exchange program gives Rotarians and their families the opportunity to host and visit Rotarians around the world. In addition to experiencing other cultures and making lasting friendships, an exchange provides a strong foundation for carrying out other international activities and service projects.

Types of Exchanges: There are two main types of friendship exchanges, the visitor exchange and the team exchange. In both types the participating districts agree upon the number of people or couples participating, length of stay, and other details. Rotary Friendship Exchanges are expected to be reciprocal.

Visitor exchange

The visitor exchange gives individual Rotarians, who may be accompanied by family members, the opportunity to spend a few days in the home of a Rotarian in another country. The typical visitor exchange lasts from three to seven days.

Team exchange

The team exchange allows several Rotarians or Rotary couples to travel to different communities in a host district for a period of up to one month. Univocational exchange a unique aspect to incorporate into either the team or the visitor exchange is the univocational exchange, where both the guest and host Rotarians are members of the same profession. A univocational exchange gives participants the opportunity to explore a common interest.

Volunteer/service exchange

Volunteer or service exchanges include opportunities for visiting Rotarians to participate in the service activities of a host club during an exchange
