## Meeting Notes

Past Club President Eric Rader led today's meeting, which was on-line via Zoom. There were 20 in attendance, including today's speaker. Bob Gleichauf did the invocation and talked about change, Rotary, our Club, Girl Scouts. Our Club has done re-visioning and is taking up new challenges and goals. We have to look at how will our Club change and be impactful in the future. Bob closed with a prayer of thanks. Angie Linder took a group photograph of our Zoom meeting for the X-Ray. She edited-in a late arrival to the photograph.

Lee Hollmann asked how Club recipe book is coming. Rick Goward reported we have 85 recipes, so far, and Bob Ziolkowski is the collector. Book has received generous donations that will cover cost of printing. Underwriters will each receive one free cookbook. Rick is recruiting neighbor and Rotarian Dan Houston to be a co-delivery person of the cookbooks for local recipients. Rick will mail cookbooks to long distance customers. Planning to print 250 cookbooks and price them at \$20. per book. Bob Ziolkowski encouraged us to follow sample template when submitting recipes. Dead-line to submit recipes has been extended. Martha Hnatiuk has been contacting local VIPs to submit recipes, such as Debbie Dingell, who submitted a recipe. Angie Linder is also working on the project. Our regular Club Zoom guest from India, Swaminathan Chelladurai, daughter has submitted two recipes. Jim Thorpe suggested we should get a recipe from 5101 Restaurant at HFC and PP Eric agreed to follow-up. Bob Ziolkowski mentioned recipes in cookbook are being credited to author and their Rotarian connection.

Today's guest speaker, Barbara Hendrickson from the Girl Scouts of Southeastern Michigan, was introduced by Val Murphy-Goodrich. Barb is with Visible Communications LLC and is a frequent speaker on branding and marketing plus retaining employees. Barb said she grew-up in Redford and was a Girl Scout. While attending Western Michigan University, Barb was a Girl Scout leader and worked with special needs Scouts. Both her children are boys, so she did not work with her kids in Girl Scouts. Barb shared a PowerPoint presentation about Girl Scouts.

Southeastern Michigan has 40,000 Girl Scouts and volunteers. Scouts are involved in STEM, summer and winter camping, coding, rock climbing, snow shoeing, etc. They have a Girl Scout Engagement Initiative. Girl Scouts have been around for 108 years and were developing leaders prior to women voting. Juliette Gordon Low is the founder of Girl Scouts. There are 2.5 million girls and volunteers nationwide involved with Girl Scouts. Rosa Parks and Babe Ruth were supporters of Girl Scouts. 90% of female astronauts, a four-star admiral, GM CEO Mary Barra, 50% of female US Representatives, 72% of female US Senators, and all female Secretary of States were Girl Scouts. There are Girl Scout award programs for elementary, middle school and high school age Scouts, and they have Bronze, Silver and Gold Award Programs, respectively. Girl Scouts have developed Gift of Life and STEM initiatives to earn these awards.

Girl Scout Research Initiative was a 2016 survey found 80% of Girl Scouts have a strong sense of self as compared to 68% for non-scouts. 62% of Girl Scouts will take chances as compared to 42% of non-scouts. 57% of Girl Scouts will volunteer as compared to 28% of non-scouts. 79% of Girl Scouts will take a leadership role in school, as compared to 44% of non-scouts.

Barb encouraged us to volunteer as a mentor or a leader. Host a Girl Scout badge earning project, such as Entrepreneurship badge. Arrange corporate support or financial support for Girl Scouts.

Velma Jean Overman asked about connecting with Girl Scouts regarding their STEM program and her church's STEM program. Jim Ives has been involved with Boy Scouts and appreciates both organizations and how they help develop self-esteem and self-empowerment in their Scouts. He thanked Barb for her good visual presentation and for all she does. PP Eric asked how has Pandemic affected Girl Scouts. They are meeting virtually and annual cookie sale might mostly involve porch drop-offs. Girl Scouts are concerned about safety of Girls and their customers, so you probably will not see them in public places. Besides raising money for Girl Scout activities, cookie sale teaches girls business skills.

Barbara Hendrickson thanked us for our support of Girl Scouts and shared their web address. PP Eric thanked Barb for her presentation and mentioned today's meeting was recorded on Zoom.

Jim Ives reports we are at \$2,000. of our annual \$7,000. goal for Rotary International Foundation "Every Rotarian, Every Year". Page 2 of X-Ray has thermometer of progress regarding annual goal. Let Jim Ives know if you want your name published in X-Ray as a Foundation donor. Today's meeting closed with members reciting the Four-Way Test in unison.


