Santa Snaps set move-in and assembly takes place right after Rotary today. Moving set to Warrendale picnic shelter in Hines Park in Dearborn Heights. Dearborn Rotary implemented "Happy Bucks" this meeting. If something positive has happened in your or your family's life, for a \$1.00, you can share event with Dearborn Rotary. **Diane Ives, Glenn Maleyko, Kathy Gapa, Martha Hnatiuk and Travis Furlow** all shared. We heard about a mother of four earning a black belt in karate, a niece who earned National Honor Society recognition, a granddaughter becoming a Rotary exchange student, Becker Elementary School earning national recognition for excellence, a 42 year old new father, and a daughter with a 14<sup>th</sup> birthday.

Martha Hnatiuk led today's 50/50 raffle. Shannon Peterson was the winner of \$15.

PP and **AG Val Murphy Goodrich** introduced today's speaker, Rotary District 6400 Governor Rick Caron. Backdrop for Gov. Rick's talk was a "Boldly Go" banner, Spock, Kirk and ADG Val in command color. "Boldly Go" is Rotary District 6400 theme this year. How do you improve your and other's lives.

Rick is a member of Windsor 1918 Rotary Club and Head of the Mathematics Department at University of Windsor. He has participated in four Rotary projects in Tanzania and is involved with social justice and fighting social inequity.

Gov. Rick is asked frequently by Customs during his border crossings "What is Rotary and why are you a Rotarian?" His students also ask same questions. It is difficult to answer because Rotary is involved in so much. It could be Santa Snaps helping build community, packaging 100,000 meals this Saturday, getting Rotarians involved with solving algae bloom problem in Lake Erie plus providing conflict resolution for parties on opposite ends of pollution spectrum, Rotary being largest provider of scholarships in the world, a presently available Rotary District 6400 \$30,000. peace scholarship for a master's program.

Bill Gates supports Rotary's polio eradication program. He donates \$2.00 for each \$1.00 Rotary raises to eradicate polio. It will cost \$1.2 billion to complete project of eliminating polio. Disease will be eradicated in three years, but will take an additional ten years of vaccinations to make sure polio is gone.

Rotarians are people of action making a difference in the world. Make a difference in yourself and Club. When individuals and Clubs stagnate, they are slowly dying. Gov. Rick shared a story how is grandfather kept active after retirement to remain vibrant and not stagnate and die.

Heard a story about how two members of Windsor 1918 Rotary Club banded together to get an Afghan girl an eye procedure in India to prevent blindness.

Rotary Clubs need younger members. Give them something to do and financially support their projects. Rotary started with young members, but demographics have gotten old.

Rick's daughter is leading development of a learning center in Tanzania. Cost is \$40,000. and center should open at end of August. Roof will have solar panels. It is a sustainability project. T-shirts Gov. Rick is selling are a fundraiser for learning center.

We were encouraged to attend Rotary District 6400 Conference at Grand Hotel on Mackinac Island, May 3-6, 2018. Cost is \$1395 for two people; \$1175 for one person. Price can be reduced by \$400 for first time attendees through \$150. Rotary District 6400 and local Club grants. Price includes room, food, island transportation, taxes, and hospitality suite. This is a package that is better than any package you could get going to the Grand on your own. We hope to have attendance of 640. A chocolate Star Trek emblem (made by Rick's wife) is available to each attendee. Children under 12 are free and kids 12 to 17 are each \$200.

Invite people to be Rotarians. Rotary by yourself is not Rotary. There is a power of Rotary. Be proud of what you do as a Club. Embrace your Club. Enjoy other Rotarians.

President Bob was presented a small cardboard "Boldly Go" banner. Governor Rick was presented a small evergreen seedling for planting. Rick said this might be his Christmas tree this year.

Dearborn Rotary Club meeting ended with us reciting the Four-Way Test in unison. A group photograph with Governor Rick was done at end of meeting.
